The Mayflower Compact

In the name of God, Amen. We, whose names are underwritten, the Loyal Subjects of our dread Sovereign Lord, King James, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, France and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, etc.

Having undertaken for the Glory of God, and Advancement of the Christian Faith, and the Honor of our King and Country, a Voyage to plant the first colony in the Northern Parts of Virginia; doe, by these Presents, solemnly and mutually in the Presence of God and one of another, covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil Body Politic, for our better Ordering and Preservation, and Furtherance of the Ends aforesaid; And by Virtue hereof to enact, constitute, and frame, such just and equal Laws, Ordinances, Acts, Constitutions and Offices, from time to time, as shall be thought most meet and convenient for the General Good of the Colony; unto which we promise all due Submission and Obedience.

In Witness whereof we have hereunto subscribed our names at Cape Cod the eleventh of November, in the Reign of our Sovereign Lord, King James of England, France and Ireland, the eighteenth, and of Scotland, the fifty-fourth, Anno. Domini, 1620.

MAYFLOWER COMPACT

1620

In y name of god Amen. We whose names are underwritten
the loyal subjects of our dread Sovereign Lord King James
by y grace of god, of great Britaine, France, & Ireland King
defondor of y faith, &c

Having undertaken, for y glorie of god, and advancements
of y Christian and honore of our king & country, a voyage to
plant y first Colonie in y Northern parts of Virginia. God
by these presents solemnly & mutually in y presence of god, and
one of another, Covenanted, & combine our selves together into a
Civill Body politick; for y better ordering, & preservation & fur-
therance of y ends aforesaid; and by vertue hereof to enacte,
constitute, and frame such just & equal Lawes, ordinances,
Acts, constitutions, & offices, from time to time, as shall be thought
most meete & convenient for y generall good of y Colonie: unto
which we promise all due submission and obedience. In witness
whereof we have hereunder subscribed our names at Cap-
Codd y .11. of November, in y year of y raigne of our Sovereign
Lord King James of England, France, & Ireland y eighteenth
and of Scotland y fifth fourth, An: Dom. 1620.

This was the first printed copy of the Compact.
